

HARRISON COUNTY LIFELONG LEARNING 2022

A YEAR IN REVIEW

Harrison County Lifelong Learning is the local source for adult education, technical training and certification, and connecting employers with job seekers. We partner with several educational institutions and community resources to increase the skills and abilities of citizens while empowering and enriching their lives in an effort to promote a lifetime of learning.

CERTIFIED MEDICAL TRAINING

Our partnership with Kaiser Healthcare Certification offers several medical certification courses to help students improve their skills and advance their careers within the evolving healthcare industry. Owner Lex Ann Kaiser is trained to administer a wide variety of courses including CPR/First Aid, Tuberculosis (TB) Training, and Insulin Administration Certification. Her two most popular courses, Certified Nurse Aide and Qualified Medication Aide training, are offered quarterly at Harrison County Lifelong Learning. Tuition assistance for certified medical training is available to those students who qualify using Hands-Up Scholarship grant funds from the Harrison County Community Foundation.

Certified Nurse Aide (CNA) Training teaches students the responsibilities that make them an integral part of the patient care process. The program includes 30 hours of classroom instruction and 75 hours of clinical experience. At the completion of the program, students are fully prepared for the written competency and procedure evaluation exam administered by the Indiana State Department of Health.

The Qualified Medication Aide (QMA) course is offered to current certified nurse aides in good standing on the state registry who have at least 1,000 hours work experience as a CNA. During training students learn anatomy, physiology and pharmacology as well as demonstrate competency while dispensing and passing medications. In addition to classroom instruction, this course includes a 40 hours of clinical practicum.





BUSINESS SERVICES

In an effort to connect employers with talented candidates, Harrison County Lifelong Learning organizes several Job Fairs. This year, over 30 local employers, with more than 500 openings, attended our Job Fairs at the Harrison County Fairgrounds and at Harrison County Lifelong Learning. Additionally, the learning center offered employer-sponsored job fairs for Jasper Engines and Transmissions and Fred Smith Store Fixtures. In total more than 200 people visited the Job Fairs to find new career opportunities.

Harrison County Lifelong Learning's website (www.HarrisonLifelongLearning.com) includes an active Jobs Board where local employers can post current job openings.

In 2022, nearly 100 businesses were served by Lifelong Learning's outreach initiatives including job postings, job fairs, promotional videos, computer classes, technical training and social media content.

CDL TRUCK DRIVER TRAINING PROGRAM

Early in 2022 Jasper Engines and Transmissions donated a retired trailer to Harrison County Lifelong Learning for use in the CDL truck driver training program that is offered in partnership with FIE Truck Driving School.

Thanks to a grant award from Lucas Oil Products and the help of their professional design team, the 48' trailer was vinyl wrapped with Harrison County Lifelong Learning's new logo and eye-catching images. The trailer will be used across Southern Indiana as FIE Truck Driving School trains student drivers for CDL class A licensure. The newly designed trailer was unveiled at Harrison County Lifelong Learning's Job Fair in November with representatives from Jasper Engines & Transmissions and Lucas Oil Products.

WELDING CERTIFICATION

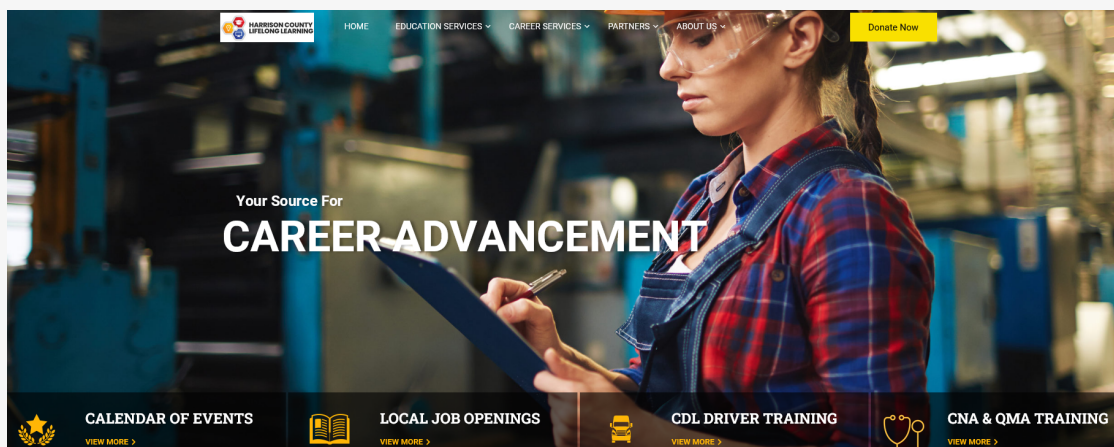
This 80-hour program prepared students for certification in Flux-Cred Arc welding processes through the study of procedures and standards established by the American Welding Society (AWS).

Offered in partnership with Ivy Tech Community College, the welding courses was held at Corydon Central High School in the fall of 2022. Eligible students were awarded Workforce Ready Grant funds to complete training and earn their certification.

COMPUTER EDUCATION

Chad Snow with Louisville Consulting Group conducted several Microsoft Excel workshops throughout the year. More than 50 students participated in Introduction and Intermediate level courses in an effort to become proficient in spreadsheet software.

Kari Johnson with Penny Tracker LLC conducted QuickBooks Online Basics to help individuals and small business owners apply accounting and reporting principles, understand the workflow for their business operations and customize their accounts.



SUPPORT OUR MISSION CAMPAIGN

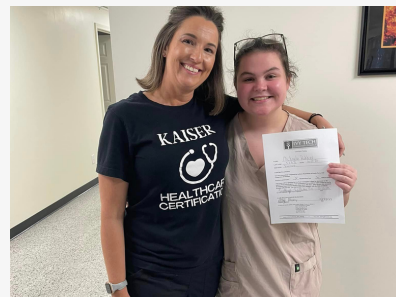
